### Amarone (by the bottle)

These wines are made in the Veneto region using the passito method. The grapes are dried in a cool airy room until they are almost raisinized before being crushed for wine making. The resulting wine is concentrated and rich with flavor.

### Super Tuscan (by the bottle)

The term "Super Tuscan" came into vogue in the late 1980's when several red wines from tuscany began attracting international attention with superlative wines made from non-traditional wine grapes like Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Syrah, and 100% Sangiovese when not authorized. The following are expressive examples of this new category.
